Medical Education Management Pathway Professional Practice MSc

The University of Kent's Global and Lifelong Learning Department offers the opportunity for those involved in the administration, coordination and facilitation of medical education in medical education centres and other settings to obtain a Master's level qualification relevant to their professional practice.

About the course

- Suitable for medical education managers at all levels of their career
- The award of Postgraduate Certificate on successfully completing the first year
- The award of Postgraduate Diploma on successfully completing the second year
- Three years part-time study to complete the MSc
- Modular on-line blended delivery at weekends (including Fridays)

Course structure, content and delivery

All students on the MSc Professional Practice Medical Education Management pathway take the following core modules:

Stage 1 (PgCert)

Online induction: Thu 28 Sep 2023

Evidence based practice – 30 credits

- Weekend 1: Fri 29 Sep – Sun 1 Oct 2023
- Weekend 2: Fri 10 – Sun 12 Nov 2023

Introduction to Medical Education Management – 30 credits

- Weekend 1: Fri 19 – Sun 21 Jan 2024
- Weekend 2: Fri 8 – Sun 10 March 2024

Stage 2 (PgDip)

Contemporary Issues in Medical Education Management – 30 credits

- Autumn term 2024 (dates to be confirmed in spring 2024)



Research skills – 30 credits

- Spring term 2025 (dates to be confirmed in spring 2024)

Stage 3 (MSc)

Work-related project and dissertation – 60 credits

- Autumn term 2025 – Summer term 2026 (dates to be confirmed in spring 2025)

Teaching and assessment

Teaching is structured around a series of extended taught weekends (on average four weekends a year) and delivery will be online, blended synchronous and asynchronous sessions. (Students will be required to have access to equipment necessary for online study.)

Timings: Friday-Sunday 09:00-17:00 (plus induction prior to the first module)

You will be asked to undertake preparatory module reading and associated tasks, prepare and deliver presentations and carry out work-based investigations.

This course is 100% coursework assessed.

Fees

Annual fees for 2023/24 are £3,200 and are subject to incremental rises. Postgraduate student loans for Master's degrees are available (subject to eligibility criteria).
